Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back to a new Term and the beginning of a new Semester of school. Last Sunday, on the final day of the holidays I was at mass and one of my favourite stories was recounted in the Gospel - the story of Mary and Martha. As we recall, Mary was happy to sit contentedly at the feet of Jesus, listening to him talk, while her sister Martha ran around the house, trying to be hospitable to all the guests and attentive to everyone's needs. Martha was clearly overwhelmed, and a bit cranky at her sister for not helping. So she asked Jesus to make Mary help with the chores. Jesus

reminded Martha that Mary's role was to be in relationship with him at that time, and that Martha should respect this. Here are five things I have learned about this story

- 1. True hospitality is always in style welcoming people into your home is a gift. We shouldn't have to worry about the stain on the couch caused by spilled juice, or the dust on the shelf that seems to come back no matter how often you dust! True hospitality wraps a person up in a hug and makes them feel special, welcomed and truly wanted. It's not about the perfect decor or the matching towels in the bathroom.
- 2. Comparison breeds anxiety and discontent while Mary sits and listens to Jesus, Martha is working like a mad woman to make everything perfect for her guests. With zero help. She feels a bit put out, and begins to compare herself to Mary, realising that she may have drawn the short straw! It's the same with us, when we compare our lives to the "insta perfect" lives of others. But these social media snapshots of a perfect life fail to reveal the truth.... The toddler's tantrum moments after the photo was taken, or the argument before the photo, trying to get everyone to pose perfectly! I have learned that comparison doesn't change anyone's story, it just steals your joy.



- 3. When you are struggling, go to the best source first! Martha didn't whinge or complain to others behind her sister's back. She didn't complain on a facebook chat group. Instead, she went straight to the source that she felt could fix things. She asked Jesus to intervene and make her life easier. And even though He didn't do as she asked, Martha had the right idea.
- 4. You can tell Jesus anything Jesus didn't get angry with Martha when she complained. He listened to her and accepted her tirade for what it was the complaint of an overworked woman. He didn't jump on the defensive and argue that he was overworked too. He didn't dismiss her as being "hormonal" or of being too critical of Mary. Instead he listened. With no judgement, he accepted her complaint for what it was and then explained his position to her. Jesus loves it when we talk to him and he listens without preconceived ideas and arguments.
- 5. The path to peace begins with one thing Jesus tells Martha that she worried too much. He explains that she needn't be concerned about rushing around and making everyone happy. She just needs to enter into relationship with him and the other guests. When we focus on Jesus first, we discover that inner peace and strength are given to us so that we can handle anything that is thrown our way.

Dear Families

We recently underwent a change with how we collect permission for excursions, including whole school events like the Athletics Carnival. At present, we are still using paper forms for excursions that involve the collection of money, like sports gala days.

Last week, we had to collect permission for the rescheduled Athletics Carnival. We had previously sought feedback from families about collecting permission forms online, through Skoolbag. This feedback was

overwhelmingly positive. However, we are still seeing a number of forms being returned after the due date. The impact of this is quite significant. 98 children had not had their permission form submitted 2 days before the carnival and 22 children still did not have their permission form submitted the day before.

To ensure all children could attend the carnival, we spent over 4 hours reconciling the missing permission forms over 3 days, informing families that still needed to submit their forms and then contacting families who had still not submitted their forms by phone, the day before, to ensure permission was submitted for these children. The impact of this lost time meant that I was unable to conduct my EMU Maths group and not provide instructional support for Numeracy in two classrooms.

I ask that you please work with us to ensure permission forms for excursions, including sports gala days, are submitted by the due date. This will help reduce the amount of time currently needed to check returned permission forms. The unfortunate outcome of a child not having parental consent, to attend an excursion or sports event, means we can not send that child to the planned excursion. We chase up these missing forms, as we do not want the children to miss out.
