In Week 3, we will host our annual School Information Night. This night is designed to provide you with an opportunity to gain a deeper understanding of our School Goals for 2019 and meet your child's 2019 teachers during a whole group discussion.

One common framework that underlines each of our goals this year is the importance of learners developing their skills and knowledge on three levels: surface level, deep level, and transfer level.


This framework is all about developing a learner's confidence, giving them the knowledge and skills to connect their learning to other ideas

and applying that information to various situations (McDowell, M. 2017).

The three levels of this framework can be described as:

Surface Level: Refers to a learner's ability to understand single or multiple ideas. They are building knowledge and skills about a particular topic.

Deep Level: Refers to a learner's ability to relate multiple ideas. Learners understand how to relate multiple skills and knowledge, built up on each other to understand specific ideas about a topic.



Transfer Level: Refers to a learner's ability to apply basic and complex understandings and skills to a new context. Learner's are able to link ideas in new ways to new contexts.

As Dylan Wiliam (2011) writes, "As teachers, we are not interested in our students' ability to do what we have taught them to do. We are only interested in their ability to apply their newly acquired knowledge to a similar but different context.

I look forward to working with you this year and seeing you at our Information Night on Tuesday 12 February, commencing at 6pm.

Please be assured of complete confidentiality with regards to any information you are asked to provide.

Please be advised that unless alternative arrangements have been made regarding the payment of your account it will be assumed that full payment will be made on or before the due date. Fees are payable in accordance with the Diocesan School Fees Policy which states "all fees are due and payable within 30 days of the date the school account statement is issued". Outstanding accounts will be forwarded to Catholic Education Diocese, Parramatta, for actioning. ## How do our School Awards Work?

#### Level 1 - PBS4L Token

- Given out free and frequently
- All staff use every day
- Students collect tokens and keep until end of the day
- Tokens are collected and placed in designated class Token Zone that contributes to a Class Reward
- One token from each House colour will be drawn each week for an individual award.
- Ideas for Class Rewards: technology afternoon, games afternoon, sports afternoon, movie afternoon, class party. Students will collaborate with teachers to design their reward list.
- Token rewards stand on their own- they do not cash in for Assembly Awards etc.

#### Level 2 - St Finbar's Assembly Awards

- Awards: Be Safe, Be Respectful, Be a Learner, Living our Faith in daily Life
- Awarded at each assembly (Week 3, 6 and 9 of each term)
- Each class teacher will hand out a minimum of three awards at each assembly (Be Safe, Be Respectful and Be a Learner Award)
- Student Learning Support and Specialist Teachers will also provide awards for each assembly.
- Living our Faith in Daily Life awards would be given out for extra curricular activities ie. ANZAC march.
- The class teacher, in our student database, will track the students awarded St Finbar's Assembly Awards.

#### Level 3 - Special Awards

- Awarded for accumulated St Finbar's Assembly Awards
- St Finbar's Bronze Award (5 St Finbar's Assembly Awards)
- St Finbar's Silver Award (10 St Finbar's Assembly Awards)
- St Finbar's Gold Award Morning Tea each term (15 St Finbar's Awards)



**Safer Internet Day** raises awareness about the positive role of digital technology and explores ways we can all contribute to creating a better, safer internet. Coordinated by the Office of the eSafety Commissioner in Australia and celebrated in over 130 countries, this year's Safer Internet Day theme is 'Together for a better internet'.

Parents are encouraged to get involved and support our young people in developing the critical skills required to successfully navigate the online world. These skills take time to develop but they can help us in all areas of life - online and off. We like to call them the 4Rs...

Respect - I treat myself and others the way I like to be treated

Responsibility - I am accountable for my actions and I take a stand when I feel something is wrong

**Reasoning** - I question what is real

Resilience - I get back up from tough situations

Help spread the word about creating a safer, more positive internet—start a conversation with your child about which of the 4Rs of online safety is most important to them and how can they help build a better internet for everyone.

This year, as part of the wider celebration of Safer Internet Day, we encourage all of our parents, students and teachers to review their privacy settings associated with their social media accounts and adjust as necessary to ensure our own personal safety and privacy.



Use the <u>Privacy Checkup</u> to review and adjust your settings to make sure you're sharing with who you want. You might also want to review photos and posts that someone has tagged you in. If you don't like something you're tagged in, you can remove the tag or ask the person who tagged you to remove the post.



Anyone can view your profile and posts on Instagram. You can make your posts <u>private</u> so that only followers you approve can see them. If your posts are set to private, only your approved followers will see them on hashtag or location pages. You might also want to check that you actually know your <u>followers</u> in real life.





Configure your Snapchat profile to only receive messages from users on your <u>My</u> <u>Friends list</u> and to control who you share your stories with. This might be a good opportunity to review your <u>MyFriends</u> list to ensure that you have only people who you know in real life. You might also want to check that <u>SnapMap</u>, a location-based service is disabled for your own personal safety and privacy.

The Office of the eSafety Commissioner's <u>iParent</u> portal is packed with resources to help you address online safety with your children.
