At assembly on Monday morning I referenced the Gospel reading from Sunday and showed the children some gold coins. The Gospel was from Luke and included the following passage:

"Blessed are you who are poor, for the kingdom of God is now yours. Blessed are you who are hungry, for you will be satisfied.

Blessed are you who are now weeping,

For you will laugh.

Blessed are you when people hate you, and when they exclude and insult you....rejoice and leap for joy on that day!

Behold, your reward will be great in heaven." Lk 6:17, 20-26.

I explained to the students that Jesus was not asking them to give up money, food or laughter, but to be mindful of those who are less fortunate than ourselves. The real treasure that Jesus was talking about is the treasure we receive from building relationships with each other. #### Facilities update

I am sure that everyone is aware of the building works that occurred over the Christmas break. This involved a complete refit of the Early Stage One classroom and necessitated a move in classrooms for Stages One and Three, plus a relocation of the art and drama room. The interior work is nearing completion in Kindergarten, and we are just awaiting the final fit out for the bathroom area, and pinboards to be placed around the room. Last week there was a meeting between the builder, architect, myself and Kindergarten staff to discuss the type of environment that we require for the sensory garden. The photos show that excavation work has already begun, and the slab and poured concrete areas will be established soon. The garden will try to encompass the already beautiful bush area by reusing as much bush rock and plants as we can, whilst creating a functional learning and play space, equipped with outdoor sinks, water play features, specific sensory equipment and gardening areas. I appreciate all for being so supportive and accommodating while this work continues.

At the start of each school year, teachers across K-6 conduct a Mathematics Assessment Interview (MAI) with every child. The Mathematics Assessment Interview is one part of our whole school approach to Numeracy.

#### So, why do we use the MAI?

The Mathematics Assessment Interview (MAI) is a clinical interview with an associated research based framework of growth points that describe key stages in the learning of 4 Number domains in mathematics. The 4 number domains consist of Counting, Place Value, Addition and Subtraction and Multiplication and Division.

The MAI is used across primary schools in the diocese, to assess the needs of each student in the 4 number domains. This data enables us to target our teaching and intervention to cater for the needs of each student.

The Mathematics Assessment Interview provides insights into children's current mathematical thinking. It is a tool that can be matched to professional knowledge about the expected course and rate of children's learning. The growth point framework is a research based learning trajectory that teachers can use to establish where students are and where to next. They are major checkpoints in children's mathematical thinking and use of strategies.

Growth points are useful because they help us:

- Understand how children learn;
- Assess and monitor children's growth in understanding;
- Identify children who are at risk;
- Identify your child's stage of number sense development;
- Plan & target teaching so that teachers can identify the experiences that will most effectively help children achieve the next growth point in their mathematical learning.

As you are the most important partner in your child's learning, it is imperative that you receive information about what your child was able to demonstrate in the interview and where to next.

Next week, each family will receive an email that provides you with feedback about your child's development in the 4 Number domains. This feedback will outline what you child is currently able to do and where to next. I trust you will find this feedback valuable and assist you in targeting these areas of growth with your child.


