This week we are nearing the middle of Lent. The gospel last weekend was about the transfiguration of Jesus on top of the mountain. Here, Jesus was joined by Elijah and Moses and it was here that Jesus was revealed to the disciples as the Son of God. God spoke to them and said "This is my Son, whom I have chosen. Listen to Him." Lk9:35

Jesus knew that he was headed for the cross and that his death would shake his followers to the core, so he gave them this vision to strengthen their faith, and encourage them, even as they watched him arrested, tortured and killed.

There is always more to an experience, to an encounter that meets the eye. Just as the disciples had their own eyes opened to the revelation of who Jesus was, we can have our eyes opened in encounters, and God encourages us to see the "more" in the other person. When have your eyes been opened to the full dignity of another person? What is it that sometimes prevents us from seeing the "more"? What types of things get in our way of "staying awake" to see God's glory, just as the apostles did on the mountain with Jesus?

Seeing and listening with the heart enables us to grow in encountering "the more" in others and all creation.

As Pope Francis says,

"We need to practice the art of listening, which is more than simply hearing. Listening, in communication, is an openness of heart which makes possible that closeness without which genuine spiritual encounter



cannot occur. Listening helps us to find the right gesture and word, which shows that we are **more than** simply bystanders. Only through such respectful and compassionate listening can we enter the paths of true growth and awaken a yearning for the Christian ideal: **the desire to respond fully to God's love and to bring to fruition what God has sown in our lives.**" (The Joy of the Gospel #171)

Help us to be a people who can take our part in the transfiguration by revealing to others the fullness of their dignity.

During the week I was visited by Ms Christine Howe, Director of Learning for St Finbar's. We had a robust discussion about learning and assessment and conducted a learning walk. Ms Howe was very impressed with our students and commended us on the deep learning she witnessed at St Finbar's. I might add that the students were very welcoming and open in their conversations, showing our visitor what it means to be a part of St Finbar's community - being safe, being a learner and being respectful.

On this day, people all around the world celebrate the lives and achievements of people with Down syndrome, creating a global voice, advocating for the rights, inclusion and wellbeing of people with Down syndrome. Our objective is to raise awareness of Down syndrome in our school setting and to enhance the social and educational inclusion of children with Down syndrome in our school community.

We want to get everyone talking about WDSD, so wear your socks...BUT NOT JUST ANY SOCKS...wear official LOTS OF SOCKS logo socks, other brightly coloured socks, long socks, printed socks, 1 sock...maybe even 3 socks for 3 chromosomes.

Complaint Handling Procedures

NESA requires all schools to publicise their complaint handling procedures. This is to ensure that parents and other community members know where to go to get information, how to make a complaint, how the complaint will be handled and how the outcome will be communicated to them.

An overview of the process is graphically represented below.

The recommended procedure to be followed by parents for informal complaints

The first point of contact is the child's class teacher. Contact the school office to make an appointment with the teacher concerned. This could also include an email Via stimbars@parra.catholic.edu.au, telephone call or letter/student diary entry.



If parents are not satisfied with the solutions offered, or believe that they have not been given a fair hearing, they are encouraged to make an appointment with the Assistant Principal.



Should the issue remain unresolved after this time, an appointment is made with the Principal to further discuss the issues.

The recommended procedure to be followed by parents for formal complaints

Formal school based complaints are put in writing using the Complaint Form which is available in paper form or electronic form on the school website or through our Skoolbag App. The principal will establish a process to deal with the complaint.

seriousness of the
complaint;
Assess the
appropriateness of
each option for
resolution;
Keep the resolution
as close to the source
of the complaint as
possible.



If the School Leadership
Team does not resolve the
matter in a timely manner,
or parents believe the
outcome is unacceptable, or
the complaint is against the
principal, parents should
contact at the Catholic
Education Diocese of
Parramatta who has
procedures for ensuring
that complaints are
handled fairly.
