Dear Parents and carers,

I warmly welcome you all back after our Easter holiday break. I hope that you had a chance to celebrate Easter with family and friends, and that you were able to have a restful and relaxing break. During the holidays I went to Melbourne to visit my sister and her husband. While we were there, my family had the opportunity to go to a Swans v Tigers AFL match. My sister's family are all avid Richmond supporters, and we must have looked like an

odd bunch riding the train, one group wearing black and yellow, the other wearing red and white! One passenger asked me about the rivalry between the families, commenting that it must be difficult when the teams play each other. I explained that even though we were supporting rival teams it didn't really matter who won, as someone would be going home happy. The passenger couldn't comprehend the fact that the whole family didn't support one team, and I was told that families often support teams for generations even if they have moved out of the area. I was amazed at the sense of loyalty that this fan showed, and at Mass on Sunday, when we heard the Gospel reading about Peter showing unswerving loyalty to the risen Christ it reminded me of this Richmond fan. She was so passionate about her team, and wanted others to feel the same passion. Three times, Jesus asked Peter to "Feed my sheep" - to become the face of evangelisation and spread the good news of the risen Lord to everyone. Jesus asked Peter to be the one who brought the resurrection to the world.



Easter, the feast of the Resurrection, gives us the joyful message that we are a "Resurrection people." This means that we are not supposed to lie buried in the tomb of our sins, bad habits and dangerous addictions. It gives us the Good News that no tomb can hold us down anymore - not the tomb of despair, discouragement or doubt, nor that of death. Instead, we are expected to live a joyful and peaceful life, constantly experiencing the real presence of the Risen Lord in all the events of our lives. "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad" (Psalm 118:24).

I am sure this term will bring us much joy and gladness, as we work, pray and learn together.

Teachers as Learners

Last week, as part of our professional learning, the staff went on a "gallery walk" into each classroom. The aim was for teachers to talk to each other about the Learning Progressions in Literacy and how they could be tracked in each learning space. The conversations were robust and showed that teachers have a great understanding of what they are teaching and how they intend to track progress for individual students.

Currently, at St Finbar's, we are focussing on creating texts, in particular crafting ideas, and text forms and features. The "Bump It Up" walls in each space allow students to work at their own pace to provide evidence of achievement, leading to achieving personal goals.

Mother's Day Mass and Breakfast



PBS4L Focus: I will be at the right place at the right time

At St Finbar's, it is important that we are safe by being at the right place at the right time. This is during class time in the learning spaces, when we are on the playground and ensuring we stay in our correct play space as well as when we are moving around the school to the bathroom, other classrooms, the office or the hall.

Examples:

- When I am in the classroom, I listen to my teachers instructions
- When I am in the classroom, I move around the space by walking
- When I am in the classroom, I move to the space I have been asked to quickly and quietly
- When I am in the classroom, I make sure I am doing the right thing by looking at what others are doing around me and listening to the teachers feedback
- When I am on the playground, I wear my hat to keep me sun safe
- When I am on the playground, I walk to my play space with my teacher
- When I am on the playground, I stay in the correct play space for the duration of playtime
- When I am on the playground, if I need to go to the bathroom I ask the duty teacher and then return back to the space when I am finished
- When I am on the playground, I stay in bounds with the right equipment
- When I am moving around the school, I walk safely with a partner
- When I am moving around the school, I move quickly and quietly then moving back to class when I am finished

The Cool Kids program is an evidence-based (Macquarie University) anxiety support and therapy program that can be of support to families and children when primary-age children are experiencing high levels of anxiety. We have accredited therapists who can offer an information session in your school or community setting which will address topics such as:

- What is anxiety?
- How to recognise what is happening when anxiety is present
- Parent-child interactions and how anxiety might surface in these
- Fighting fear by using detective thinking
- Building skills while facing fears
- Maintaining gains and coping with setbacks
