



Faith, Truth, Knowledge

In Week 9, we will be holding our Semester 1 Family Learning Conferences. These conferences are an important part of the report process for families.

At the end of Week 8, you will receive your child's Semester 1 Report. This is a time of celebration, as it tracks the progress that your child has made over the last two terms at school.

The report addresses each Key Learning Area that your child engages in. The Semester 1 report will not have a General Comment. There are a number of reasons for this decision.

Firstly, we value the importance of the conversation that takes place at our Semester 1 Learning Conferences. It is at these interviews that more specific, individualised and detailed information can be shared. This information can cover all facets of school life, rather than a comment that is limited by the amount of characters that the report structure provides.

Secondly, a shared discussion based on formative feedback helps us outline the next steps and future learning strategies for your child. The conversation about your child's learning was started at the beginning of the year, at our Family Learning Conferences, and we want to continue this conversation and jointly construct the learning goals for the future.

Finally, at the Learning Conference, we can provide you with the specific feedback that can address your questions. Our hope is that this report is not just viewed as a document that provides data on your child, but the continuation of a dialogue that will provide constructive feedback to motivate and engage your child in their learning. It will encourage them to develop the skills to self-assess and to critically analyse their own learning.

The Semester 2 Report will have a comment section. It is only the Semester 1 Report that does not have this component. At this point in their learning journey, we would like the learning conversation to be about where to next. It is important that we work together to meet the individual needs of your child and continue to develop a positive partnership.

We encourage all parents to take up the opportunity to attend an interview in Week 9. A letter outlining how to book the interviews will be distributed on Thursday of Week 7.

Pentecost

This Sunday, the 9th June, we celebrate the feast of Pentecost. This is a very significant feast day as it marks the coming of the Holy Spirit and the end of the Easter season. We see the disciples huddled in a room and afraid to venture into the world. With a wind and marked by fire, they are blessed with the Spirit and

strengthened to follow Christ. In sending us the Holy Spirit, Jesus breathes his own life into us. It is the Holy Spirit who lives in us and keeps us faithful to Jesus and able to do anything that following Jesus requires. In Confirmation we are blessed and sealed with the Holy Spirit, received beforehand at Baptism. We talk about the gifts of the spirit: wisdom, understanding, knowledge, right judgement, awe and wonder,



courage and reverence. When we use these gifts we see that there are good things that happen as a consequence. St Paul refers to these as the fruits of the spirit. Remembering that the Holy Spirit is with us is a great source of comfort and a reason to celebrate.

We will come together as a school community on Tuesday 11th June at **1pm**, in the Parish Hall, to celebrate the Feast of Pentecost. We warmly invite all our families and friends to join us. Stage Three will be leading us in prayer. (**PLEASE NOTE** change in time from 9am to 1pm).
