Dear Parents and Carers

Last Sunday we celebrated the feast of the Most Holy Trinity. If you were asked to explain the trinity you would probably say that Christians believe in one God, present in three forms - God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit. You would probably also say that it's a mystery that is incredibly difficult to explain., and you would be right. After mass on Sunday my family went to brunch, as we do on many Sundays. We ordered our food and I noticed that each of us had included eggs as some part of our meal - poached, fried, or scrambled. It got me

thinking about the Trinity, and how a simple egg could be used to explain the mystery and the blessing of the Trinity.

We know an egg is made up of three parts - the shell, the white and the yolk. If we look at each part it provides a powerful image that helps explain the mystery of the Holy Trinity.

The yolk represents God's person - His Being and His Holiness. It is the source of nourishment and is at the centre of the whole egg. The white of the egg represents the Holy Spirit - because God's person is not one that we can approach physically, the Spirit or the white of the egg acts as insulation. We know that it is through the Holy Spirit that God can communicate, speak through and interact with humankind. The egg shell is the embodiment of the egg, taking on its shape and form. It is the image of the yolk and the white. This is Jesus. The white of the egg is the connection between the yolk and the shell. Jesus' person is joined to the Father through the Holy Spirit, because God's Spirit is also Jesus' Spirit. The Spirit is also their to guard and protect us through our lives, and when the time comes for



our shell to be cracked, to leave our earthly home, it is the Spirit who will hold you and carry you to your Father.

Three persons in one God. Three persons who love us with an indescribable love and who want to help us do great things in our lives. Three persons who want to draw us into their communion of love. What a great God we have, and what a wonderful thing is the simple egg!

God, I believe that you are the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Help me to know you in a more personal way.

Reports





Adoration & Benediction: Usually after Friday morning Mass.




Mobile Phone Devices and Bike and Scooter Policy


