



Dear Parents and Carers,

I have this old jumper that I love. It is almost twenty years old. It is stretched out of shape, has a tear in the shoulder seam, is quite threadbare in places, and is becoming more faded with every wash. But I love this jumper, and

it's one of the first things I reach for on a cold night or if I'm feeling unwell. It gives me a sense of comfort and reassures me that everything will be ok. I feel warm and content when I wear it, even though I know it should have been sent to the scrap heap years ago! In fact,





And then, this week I was reading St Paul's third letter to the Colossians and I was struck by how similar Paul's message was. He talked about "taking off the old self with its practices, and putting on the new self, which is being renewed, for knowledge, in the image of its creator" (Col 3:9-10) Paul wasn't referring to my old jumper, but his message reminded me that sometimes we need to step out of our comfort zone, put the old ways aside to embrace the new. In Paul's letter, he was referring to the old self becoming new through baptism. He was reminding the Colossians that they may have acted a certain way in the past, but now, with Jesus in their hearts and by their side, it was now time for them to change their ways, and to put the past in the past. Paul is telling them Just get rid of it! You have something infinitely better to wear!



This isn't always easy to do.... Like my lovely old jumper, it might take us a while to completely cast our old behaviours aside. So often we lose sight of our wonderful new life with Jesus, and we give in to old temptations because they are comfortable. But if we remember what God has done for us - and still wants to do - we can shake the familiar and embrace the new and unfamiliar. Who knows... we just may come to love the new version even better!

Lord, give me the grace and the strength to leave behind everything that stands between me and you. Amen.

#### Dear Families

We have recently had a few low level behaviours occurring where children are being rude and mean to one another during social interactions. This can involve the use of rude language, pulling or pushing, annoying behaviours, like squirting water on someone, closing their chromebook whilst they are working, moving items that someone has placed on their desk and throwing someone's hat or ball away.

When you look at these events in isolation, they are quite small. But when teachers are getting stories like this after some break sessions, it has an impact on learning time and the welfare of our children during play time. This stress then comes back into the classroom, and we know that stressed brains do not learn.

We pride ourselves on working positively with behaviours. We prompt and reteach the expectation. We provide special lessons and social stories to help children learn from their choices. 99% of the time they do not repeat the same behaviour.


As we come to the end of term, we often see a spike in these types of incidents. I ask you to please be proactive with your child and talk to them about ensuring they are using kind words, not exhibiting annoying behaviours and importantly being safe and respectful towards others.

This will help ensure we maximise learning time and help reduce some of the stress that can come off the

playground.

## Kinder Learning Through Play

On August 27th, several teachers attended the course **Play Matters**, at the NSW Teachers Federation. We were incredibly fortunate to hear Dee O'Connor, an Associate Professor of Education, speak at length on the theory of play and why it is a fundamental aspect of childhood education. We learned about research projects in neuroscience, and discussed ways this research can enhance our understanding of brain development.

As a result, we have been able to continue planning play experiences that align to our pedagogies, with a focus on social and dramatic play being a catalyst for literacy building, and construction and

kinaesthetic play as catalysts for mathematical awareness,

communicating and reasoning.

We look forward to continuing to implement innovative strategies for investigative learning, which is guided and linked to intentional teaching.

## A student engaged in the Number Nook

The student created an array of 100 objects. The teacher then approached and removed a section, creating a partial array. The student's challenge was to find the most efficient way to



count how many objects had been removed and how many were left. He demonstrated multiple counting strategies, communicating and reasoning his choices as he went.








Students engaged in Nature Play, searching for samples of things found in our environment. They later categorised the objects as living or non-living and justified their reasoning.

The benefits of Nature Play are infinite. As students navigate the landscape they learn to

judge uneven heights, conditions and surfaces, thereby strengthening coordination and balance skills, which are crucial to brain development. The process also allows them to engage in risk assessment and problem solving, skills which are essential to creating successful learning dispositions.

We look forward to continuing to implement innovative strategies for investigative learning, which is guided and linked to intentional teaching.
