From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Next Wednesday we experience Ash Wednesday, one of the most important dates in our church's liturgical calendar. Ash Wednesday takes place 46 days before Easter Sunday. Ash Wednesday comes from the ancient Jewish tradition of penance and fasting. The practice includes the wearing of ashes on the head. The ashes symbolize the dust from which

God made us. As the priest applies the ashes to a person's forehead, he speaks the words: "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Ashes also symbolize grief, in this case, grief that we have sinned and caused division from God. One of the Gospel readings for the week was from Mark. In this Gospel, Jesus told the crowd that 'whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me.' (Mk 8:34) Jesus makes a very strong point. If we want to follow Him we need to follow His example... not just with our words but with our actions. With the season of Lent beginning next week, let's remember that during Lent we undergo change, and we become renewed through sacrifice, alms giving and prayer. If we want to put our faith into action then this is the perfect time to think about some practical ways we can exercise our faith, and help it to grow by our actions.

This week Mrs Brown and Mrs Borg attended a FIAT meeting to develop a plan to bring FIAT to St Finbar's. FIAT stands for Faith in Action Team. This group of students, led by Mrs Borg and Mrs Brown will be looking for ways that they can follow in the footsteps of Jesus in practical ways. More information will be available after this initial team meeting, and we look forward to helping our students to live out their faith through their actions.

Our Learning Goals

This year we are focusing on two goals. At our parent meeting last week these goals were shared and unpacked with the parents who attended. I am including them here for those unable to make the parent evening.

Learning Goal for Teachers:

As teachers, we will analyse and use data to inform instruction and effectively set goals to ensure that students are challenged in their thinking and learning to achieve maximum individual growth.

Learning Goal for Students:

I will grow as a learner by challenging myself and using feedback to help me achieve my learning goals





Formation Goal for Teachers

We will engage with the four elements of prayer in our Church, through deep engagement and inquiry, so that we can grow as active participants in our faith community.

Formation Goal for Students

I can use different types of prayer forms to communicate with God.

These student goals have been put up in every learning space at St. Flnbar's and are referred to often.

Uniform Policy

The St Finbar's <u>school uniform</u> is one that was agreed upon by parents through consultation in 2018. While we are still within a two year changeover period, the expectation is that children are dressed in the expected school uniform each day. I have noticed that some children are not wearing correct sport shoes, and I have seen some converse style shoes being worn. These are not healthy for children to be running and playing sport in as they do not have an arch. Flat styled sport shoes can cause harm to small feet, ankles and knees, so I ask you to please ensure that all sports footwear is supportive.

This year will be the last year that students will be able to wear the old style sports shirt and shorts, with an exception to Stage 3 students. Hats are compulsory for all students each day. If a student does not have a hat, they will be asked to sit off the playground in the shade. Compulsory school hats are available for purchase from The School Locker. There is an option to have your order delivered to school with free shipping.

On Tuesday 3 March The School Locker will be having a Pop Up Shop on site at St Finbar's in the COSHC Room. This will be from 8:45am to 10:30am. This is a great opportunity to try uniforms on your children and purchase on the day. The School Locker will have EFTPOS facilities only.

With all uniform items, we ask that you clearly label them with your child's name.

Road Safety

With the inclement weather over the past few weeks it has been noted that some parents have been dropping students off on the opposite side of the road to the school gates. This practice is extremely dangerous, especially in Levy Street, where there is no designated crossing, and cars can appear very quickly over the hill. If your child needs to cross the road in King Street please ensure that the crossing is being utilised. Otherwise, in Levy Street, please walk your children safely to the school gates or



park on the same side of the school. Your assistance in this matter is very much appreciated, as we are concerned about the safety of our children, and strive to make school a safe and supportive place.

Toys at School

From time to time children bring toys to school that might be deemed inappropriate, either because of the cost of replacing the toy should it be damaged or because of its distractibility and concerns about safe play. Often these toys generate a lot of excitement in the playground and problems can arise over taking turns and who is allowed to play with it. Sometimes parents are unaware that these toys have been packed in school bags. If we determine that a toy is unsuitable for use in the playground the toys will be taken to the office area and handed over to a parent at the end of the day, or at the parent's convenience. This would include electronic toys such as Nintendo Switch gaming consoles, portable PSP consoles, robotics, ipods, drones, remote control cars and so on. If you are unsure as to whether a toy is suitable for school please contact the school office for clarification.

Anaphylaxis and Allergies

At St Finbar's there are several students and staff members with allergies and anaphylaxis, and in order to ensure that these children are safe at school we ask you to speak with your child about the dangers of food sharing. Students with allergies are ultimately responsible for ensuring that they do not ingest anything that could be potentially harmful. An anaphylaxis and allergy note will be sent home via Skoolbag next week with some great information for parents about managing allergies.

MAI Feedback

At the start of each school year, teachers across K-6 conduct a Mathematics Assessment Interview (MAI) with every child. The Mathematics Assessment Interview is one part of our whole school approach to Numeracy.

So, why do we use the MAI?

The Mathematics Assessment Interview (MAI) is a clinical interview with an associated research based framework of growth points that describe key

stages in the learning of 4 Number domains in mathematics. The 4 number domains consist of Counting, Place Value, Addition and Subtraction and Multiplication and Division.

The MAI is used across primary schools in the diocese, to assess the needs of each student in the 4 number domains. This data enables us to target our teaching and intervention to cater for the needs of each student.

The Mathematics Assessment Interview provides insights into children's current mathematical thinking. It is a tool that can be matched to professional knowledge about the expected course and rate of children's learning.

The growth point framework is a research based learning trajectory that teachers can use to establish where students are and where to next. They are major checkpoints in children's mathematical thinking and use of strategies.

Growth points are useful because they help us:

- Understand how children learn:
- Assess and monitor children's growth in understanding;
- Identify children who are at risk;
- Identify your child's stage of number sense development;
- Plan & target teaching so that teachers can identify the experiences that will most effectively help children achieve the next growth point in their mathematical learning.

As you are the most important partner in your child's learning, it is imperative that you receive information about what your child was able to demonstrate in the interview and where to next.

Next week, each family will receive an email that provides you with feedback about your child's development in the 4 Number domains. This feedback will outline what your child is currently able to do and where to next. I trust you will find this feedback valuable and assist you in targeting these areas of growth with your child.

Challenging Drop Offs

From time-to-time, you can have a morning where the drop off at school turns into an emotional rollercoaster. Children can be in tears, and parents fluctuate between frustration and guilt. Leaving you wondering what to do or questioning, "Am I doing the right thing?" You feel guilty about leaving your child upset.

Sadly, parents can also feel like they are under the spotlight as they leave the playground. Feeling like all the other children are ready for the school day, but why not mine? Not exactly a stress-free start to the day for anyone involved!

Like most families, we had our own share of challenging drop-offs. My daughter spent Kinder, Year 1 and Year 2 latching on to my wife's hand at each morning drop off. Everyday, my wife would give her a hug, a kiss, tell her that she loved her and to have a great day, and lovingly, but firmly, would hand her off to the teacher in the playground and walk.... No turning back.

At the conclusion of each day, her teacher would always say that she stopped crying within minutes and my daughter always ran out at the end of the day smiling and happy.

The key ingredient is Let them go (Natkin, S. 2019. How to Manage Tearful Drop-Offs) It's tempting to stick around, hoping your child will stop crying. It's also tempting to sneak out, thinking that by doing so, it will be easier for your child. However, neither of these strategies work well. The long, drawn-out good-byes increase the anxiety in our children, and the quick ducking out plays into their greatest fears about being left. Instead, create a good-bye ritual with your child: Give those last hugs and kisses, and tell him you can't wait to see him after school. Then, follow through on your word and head out that gate.




Keeping kids active and occupied during wet days can be challenging. Here are some active play ideas for children indoors:

Complaints Handling Procedures

NESA requires all schools to publicise their complaint handling procedures. This is to ensure that parents and other community members know where to go to get information, how to make a complaint, how the complaint will be handled and how the outcome will be communicated to them.

An overview of the process is graphically represented below.

The recommended procedure to be followed by parents for informal complaints

The first point of contact is the child's class teacher. Contact the school office to make an appointment with the teacher concerned. This could also include an email Via stfinbars@parra.catholic.edu.au, telephone call or letter/student diary entry.



If parents are not satisfied with the solutions offered, or believe that they have not been given a fair hearing, they are encouraged to make an appointment with the Assistant Principal.



Should the issue remain unresolved after this time, an appointment is made with the Principal to further discuss the issues.

The recommended procedure to be followed by parents for formal complaints

Formal school based complaints are put in writing using the Complaint Form which is available in paper form or electronic form on the school website or through our Skoolbag App. The principal will establish a process to deal with the complaint.



The Principal will:
Address the seriousness of the complaint;
Assess the appropriateness of each option for resolution;
Keep the resolution as close to the source of the complaint as

possible.



If the School Leadership
Team does not resolve the
matter in a timely manner,
or parents believe the
outcome is unacceptable, or
the complaint is against the
principal, parents should
contact at the Catholic
Education Diocese of
Parramatta who has
procedures for ensuring
that complaints are
handled fairly.
