From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers.

Someone commented the other day about how neat my handwriting is. It made me think about a time, long ago when I was in Year One. I was not very neat, and as a six year old, I am sure my handwriting skills were on par with most Year One students. My teacher was not very happy with my style of writing, and used punishment as a way to make me practice my handwriting. She pinned my writing book on to the back of my uniform and

I was instructed to leave it on there for the remainder of the day, so everyone could see how untidy my work was. In those days you didn't argue back! But my older sister told mum what had happened when she met us at the bus stop. She was furious! We were bundled into the car and she drove straight to the school to give the teacher a piece of her mind! I am pleased to report that no child was ever subjected to such humiliation ever again, and now it's the kind of story we laugh about in my family. My mum was never shy to speak her mind, especially in defense of her children.

We all have that one person in our lives who would "go into bat" for us. As a parent, I know I would stand up for my own children whenever they needed me to, and I'm sure you all feel the same way. So did Jesus. He promised to send us an Advocate, one to protect us and "go into bat" for us when things got tough. Last Sunday's Gospel recounted Jesus explaining the role of the Holy Spirit as our advocate, or as it is was written in the Greek "parakletos" - which literally translates into "defense attorney". The Gospel reminds us that we are never alone and that whatever we have to endure, the Holy Spirit will be the one in our corner, to be our defense attorney and to ensure that we never forget just how loved we are. The Learning Agenda

Well done to all our families who have continued learning online, as well as at school on their scheduled return day. It was a joy to see children face to face and we look forward to welcoming everyone back again this week for one day of school learning. The light at the end of the tunnel has well and truly been sighted now, and as of May 25th, all students are expected to return to school in a full time capacity. Social distancing and continued personal hygiene will remain in place at school. The curriculum will be pared back somewhat to ensure that Literacy, Numeracy and RE are the main focus, with other Key Learning Areas being integrated where possible. We understand and respect that some parents do not feel comfortable about sending their child/ren to school just yet, however, online learning will no longer be supported for any student staying at home after May 25th 2020 in the same format. Learning activities will be provided. Teachers will share some learning resources in hard copy or using google classroom for any students needing to remain at home. However, this will not be remote learning as students have currently been experiencing it. Students staying home because of parental wishes will be marked as either sick, on leave or unexplained absence. Please contact the school office via the usual channels if your child is unwell or staying home for leave purposes. If you are intending to keep your child/ren home for some or all of the week please contact the school via email at stfinbars@parra.catholic.edu.au or phone on 4724 3600. We are also sending home a survey link via Skoolbag that we ask you to submit so we can gauge numbers of students returning and catching school buses.

Assessment and Reporting

The reporting process will be a little different this Semester. As you can appreciate, assessing student outcomes has been challenging whilst students are learning from home.

We, as a staff, have been exploring creative options for providing you with a Semester One report on your child's progress. One of the ways we intend to gather information is via a google form that we ask parents and students to complete together. You will need to complete one form per child. This google form will inform your child's report and assist teachers in gaining a greater understanding of the challenges and successes of learning remotely. We acknowledge that your child's engagement with and commitment towards home learning may have fluctuated at times, so we greatly value your input and observations based on your unique experience during this covid-19 lockdown period.

This google form can be accessed <u>here</u>, and we ask that all forms are submitted by the end of week five.

Pick Up and Drop Off Procedures

For the time being we are going to continue the Kiss and Drop procedures in place. This will continue for all of next week at least, so please pull up to the King Street gate and wait in the queue for your child to be let out of the vehicle. It helps us greatly if your child has their bag on their lap or next to them to ensure that parents are not having to get out of their cars to retrieve bags from car boots. Obviously, with more



children attending school next week the process may be a little slower, so please consider arriving a little earlier. Supervision will begin at 8:30am and the gates will be closed at 9:00am. Any children arriving after this time will need to be taken to the Levy St entrance for a late sign in. As our students are unable to assemble in large groups we will not be holding morning assemblies. Children will be instructed to place their bags in a new location, on the other side of the double gates leading up to the Infant's playground (adjacent to the sandpit). Each grade will be clearly marked for easy identification, and once your child's bag has been deposited, the students return to the main basketball court/synthetic grass for usual supervision of play. Once the bell rings, students line up next to their bag and wait for their teacher to escort them to class.

The afternoon pick up will be a staggered event. Any parents with children in INFANTS ONLY we ask to arrive at 3:00pm for handover at the King Street gate. Parents picking up who have PRIMARY ONLY or PRIMARY and INFANTS siblings, please arrive at 3:10pm. Parking is readily available in King St., side streets, plus the carpark adjacent to the synthetic grass. We are hoping that this staggered approach will assist with traffic congestion and social distancing practices.

Thank you again for your ongoing patience and support of all we are doing to keep our families and community as safe as we can.


National Reconciliation Week is a time for us all to celebrate and build on positive and respectful relationships and connections between Australians and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people.



Winter Uniform


