# From the Principal

Dear Parents and Carers,

Last Sunday we celebrated the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. As we read in the Gospel of John:

John 20:19-23

'The doors were closed in the room where the disciples were. Jesus came and stood among them. He said to them, Peace be with you.' The disciples were filled with joy when they saw the Lord.

'As the Father sent me, so am I sending you.'

When the Holy Spirit came to the disciples they were filled with a sense of purpose and mission, ready to go out and evangelise the world. I bet they felt a bit like we felt, when most of our students returned to school. We were filled with joy! Our role, as educators of your children is one that we see as a mission more than just a job. I am quite convinced that, after the period of home learning, parents have a better understanding of the role of an educator... except times that experience by 25 and you would experience what it is like to be in a classroom! As I have been walking around, visiting students and talking to staff, it is quite clear that everyone is happy to have returned to full time schooling, and rest assured we are back in the swing of things after our reset period. # Pick Up and Drop Off Procedures

The Kiss and Go zone in King Street has proven to be a great success. The mornings in particular have been running fairly smoothly, thanks to parents and carers sticking to the guidelines. Please refer to these guidelines if you are unsure of the Kiss and Go procedures.

- Students must have their bag inside the car with them. If you have bags in the car boot please park somewhere safely and allow children to retrieve their backpacks before walking to the school gate.
- Parents/Carers must remain in the vehicle.
- Please do not park on the school side of King Street. It creates a traffic jam and problems with the flow of traffic.
- It's ok to drop students off before reaching the head of the queue (where Mrs Clarke stands) however please ensure that your child/ren are safe leaving the vehicle and are not walking behind the vehicle. Mrs Clarke is happy to assist children leaving cars from the roadside to ensure that they make it safely to the footpath.
- Do not overtake cars dropping students off, instead wait patiently for the queue to advance and leave the curbside safely. There have been a few near misses noticed due to cars merging unsafely.
- Please observe the student crossing directions as some students are being dropped off on the opposite side of the street and need to use the crossing.

For the time being, pick up in the afternoon will remain as is, with Infants children available to be collected at the King Street gate from 3:00pm, and Primary children at the same location from 3:10pm.

Thank you again for your ongoing patience and support of all we are doing to keep our families and community as safe as we can. We appreciate you remembering to continue social distancing practices, and remind you that if you wish to see your child's teacher about any matter, please contact the school office and an appointment phone call will be arranged.

# Safeguarding the Health and Wellbeing of All at St Finbar's

We are continuing our preventative measures to ensure that the health, safety and well-being of students and staff are maintained. These measures include:

Frequent hand washing/sanitising - on arrival, as children leave the classroom for breaks, before
returning to class after play, and again at the end of the day as they leave via the King Street
gate.

- All playground equipment has been deep cleaned and is regularly sprayed with Touch Point disinfectant. Numbers are limited at any time the play equipment is in use.
- Social distancing is being encouraged with desks moved apart and children split between floor activities and desk activities.
- Youtube assemblies.
- Office procedures to allow continued social distancing and sanitisation as required.

With many restrictions being lifted, we will update you on the measures we will continue or discontinue as the information is relayed to us.

Next week (week seven) is our Sabbath Week... a time to rest and regain some time with family and friends. As such, there will be no scheduled meetings with teachers and home learning will take a break. Please use this gift of time as a way to reconnect with family and the community... go for a walk, cook together, play a game or just find time for a chat and a cuppa. Enjoy the week.

Semester One Reports

Over the last three weeks, we have been working hard to develop our Semester One Reports. Due to the home learning period, our reports this Semester will look different.

One key difference will be that the Semester One Reports will only contain feedback and results for Religious Education, English and Mathematics. This reduced report does not mean that learning and teaching has not continued in all of the other key learning areas, but our focus upon the

return of students to normal schooling has been to assess, provide feedback and capture learning data in the three key areas of Literacy, Numeracy and Religious Education.

Across Australia, schools have adjusted existing assessment and reporting processes, in compliance with NSW State and Federal government requirements, to accommodate broader changes to the teaching and learning environment during the current COVID-19 period.

This 2020 First Semester report seeks to authentically recognise and reflect students' learning in these three key areas. The 2020 Second Semester report will return to documenting progress in all key learning areas.

Another difference will be how our reports look and how they are delivered. We have redeveloped our school reports using our new school management system, Compass. Some images of how the reports will look are below.

To maximise the learning time we have this term, your child's Semester One Report will not be provided until the end of Week 1 of Term 3. This is to ensure we can maximise the time in the classroom during Term 2 to gather as much data as we can to provide a comprehensive report in Religious Education, English and Mathematics.

Compass also provides schools with the ability to give parents access to a Parent Portal. This is currently in the process of being developed and will be made available to families before the end of Term 2. At the end of Week 1 of Term 3, parents will receive the child's Semester One Report in digital format only

through the Parent Portal. This will mean, as we continue with this in the years ahead, that you will now have a secure place where all your child's historical learning reports will be stored and you will no longer need to fish through that storage box or cupboard to find your child's reports. Of course, you can print them from the portal if you prefer to keep a hard copy.

### **English**

In English, students have undertaken learning in three different areas; Speaking and Listening, Reading and Viewing, and Writing and Representing, with the components of creative and critical thinking, expressing themselves and reflecting on learning integrated into each area.

The area of Speaking and Listening requires students to communicate effectively in formal and informal settings for a range of purposes. This area requires students to listen, understand and respond to a range of topics. The area of Reading and Viewing requires students to read, view and comprehend a range of texts of increasing complexity as they progress through school. The area of Writing and Representing requires students to compose persuasive, imaginative and informative texts.

During Week 8, we will be holding our Semester One Family Learning Conferences on Tuesday 16 June and Thursday 18 June. We are not able to conduct out Family Learning Conferences face to face, therefore these conferences will take place via Zoom.

A link to the Zoom meeting will be sent to you via the confirmation email for your booked time. Families will use this link to join the waiting room, prior to your meeting time, where the teacher will then admit you into the session.



A critical part of the report process is to reflect on your child's learning through open dialogue. It is especially important this year, as you will have insights that you can share with us from the time you spent at home during the Home Learning Period. It is for this reason that our Family Learning Conferences are occurring before our reports are sent out in Week 1 of Term 3.

These conferences are an opportunity for you to ask clarifying questions about your child's learning; allow the teacher to provide detailed verbal feedback; and to discuss your child's next steps. Each conference will go for 10 minutes.

Parents or carers and their child should attend this conference.







Students will need to add their first 5 choice books the same way they always have for the Challenge.

To add the bonus choice books on the Student Site, students can simply enter "2020 bonus" either on the search screen or under "add choice books", and the Bonus Choice Book records will be the first ones to appear.
