From the Principal

During the covid-19 period I, along with many others, became quite the home cook! Baking and cooking challenging dishes became family time in my household. There's something about food that brings a family together, whether it's enjoying a home baked scone or laughing over a quiche recipe that went disastrously wrong (my kids called it "quiche soup!") In my house, so many stories are shared around the dinner table or whilst cooking in the kitchen, and I relish and look forward to more of these times.

While we were cooking up a storm at home, I started to think about those that weren't as fortunate as we were. I remember once getting into trouble at school for saying that I was "starving". The Sister who overheard me proceeded to give me a stern talking to about what it really means to be starving. Going

without food for an extended period of time is a horrible thing. The longer that someone goes without nourishment, the weaker they become. It would feel as if life was slowly being drained from the body.

Last Sunday, the Gospel made it quite clear that Jesus' Body and Blood are just as vital to us as food and drink are. Without the nourishment of the Eucharist, God's life in us can slowly drain away. I recall reading an article about an extraordinary man by the name of Father Walter Ciszek. He was imprisoned in a Siberian Labor camp, and



during extremely harsh and freezing conditions he would make an effort every day at noon to make the bread of life available to his fellow prisoners. The prisoners came to depend on the Body and Blood of Christ to keep them alive as they were on the meagre rations doled out to them by the prison guards. The Eucharist was one of the most important forms of nourishment for them. Jesus was the living bread that came down from heaven and Jesus told us that "whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give you is my flesh for the life of the world" (John 6: 51)

I hope that we can be filled with gratitude as we reflect on the generosity of a God who offered his life and himself to us in the Eucharist.

Jesus, thank you for the life you give me in your Body and Blood. Amen

Family Learning Conferences

Week Nine Assembly

We have been advised that we can now begin to hold our Monday morning assemblies, provided that they last less than fifteen minutes. It was a joy to gather together to pray and sing the National Anthem this week. Our whole school assemblies are still subject to restrictions. Therefore, our week nine assembly, where we present Academic Achievement awards for Semester One, will be streamed via our Youtube channel. The location will be outdoors so that parents of students who are receiving an academic award can attend. They will be notified prior to the assembly, and we will accommodate these parents by placing seats in ways that observe a continuation of social distancing. Students will watch the assembly at the same time, and those receiving awards will be allowed to leave the room to collect them.

This includes a Doctors Certificate if the child is absent for three days or more.



At the moment we are seeing many children with various respiratory illnesses as is usual for this time of year.

The safety of all children and staff at St Finbar's is essential, so I thank you for your ongoing support.

Countdown to the Compass Parent Portal | T Minus 7 Days

Next week, families should start receiving invitations to log in to the Compass Parent Portal. Invitations are scheduled to be sent on Thursday 25 June and will come from the CEDP Office.

What does Compass do for me?

Using Compass allows you to access up-to-date and meaningful information about our school and your child's progress. Compass includes many different features, including the ability to:

- Monitor your child's attendance, and enter an explanation for absence or lateness
- Update your family contact details
- View your child's awards and the school calendar
- Download and view your child's academic reports

Accessing Compass Portal

To log in you will require your unique family username and password. These details will be provided to you by our school. Upon first login, you will be required to change your password and confirm your email address and mobile phone number. These details may be used by our school for SMS, password recovery and email communication throughout the year.











You can download the Compass App on iOS and Android devices, simply search for 'Compass School Manager' in the store. A link will also be provided to access the portal via a browser.

Using the App you can:

- View the school news feed
- Receive push notifications
- View schedules/ timetables
- Add attendance notes and approvals
- View academic reports

When you follow the link you will have the opportunity to explain their absence.


