Each year we farewell families who have children who have reached the end of their learning journey at St Finbar's. This year, however, we farewell a family who has had a special partnership with our school, for the last 53 years. This week sees the conclusion of a long-standing partnership between the Higgins and De La Mare families.

It was in 1967 when a young 5-year-old girl, Sharyn Higgins, commenced her first day of school at St Finbar's. Little did she know, but on that day she was laying down the first foundations of an historic partnership.

Sharyn, Michelle, Tania and Bradley Higgins, all commenced their first years of learning at St Finbar's. These are the children of Carmel and Frank Higgins. Sharyn's kindergarten classroom was the historic St Finbar's Church; the building we now refer to as the Fr Barlow Centre.



In 1970, many of the fathers of children who were enrolled in the school were part of the expansion of the school buildings. Not like us today, where we contribute financially to the building fund, the fathers of the children enrolled and members of the parish used their hands to contribute. Working alongside many of the other fathers, Frank Higgins helped lay the bricks and mix the mortar of the buildings that now house our learners today.

Out of the 10 grandchildren of Carmel and Frank, 5 have all attended St Finbar's over the years, Christopher, the son of Sharyn, Matthew, the eldest son of Michelle, and Patrick, Olivia and Nicola, the children of Tania and John De La Mare. Over this time, there was only one year out of the last 54 years where a member of this family has not been a part of our community.

In 1986, Carmel also commenced as a staff member at St Finbar's, in the role of Finance Secretary. After 19 years of service Carmel retired and left to hold the fort for the Higgins family line, was a young De La Mare, Tania's son Patrick who was concluding his first year of school.

Today, we farewell Nicola De La Mare, a member of the 2020 graduating class, and along with her we farewell the Higgins and De La Mare families, who conclude their 53 year partnership with St Finbar's. We know that their long standing connection with our parish will continue and despite their not being an enrolled student with these family ties at St Finbar's anymore, we know that our partnership together will continue through our strong school and parish connections.

The School Locker

To better service schools that have uniforms online, all St Finbar's stock will be moved to a new warehouse location in Wetherill Park. This is to ensure all orders are completed in a timely manner and are sent out correctly to families.

In order for this to happen, there are a few things which need to occur; Firstly, The School Locker need to turn off our online shop for 1-2 weeks, while stock is counted, packed up & moved to the new location. We will be doing this from the 16th December.

When the online shop is turned off, this also means that uniform will no longer be available at the Liverpool store.

At St Finbars we now have a complete range of sizes for all uniform items. These are available to try on via the school office. Please try where possible to phone us or email to make an appointment for fittings. This will mean you no longer have to travel to Liverpool if you are unsure of sizing, however, you will need to then order online.

Our school uniform will no longer be available at the Liverpool store after the 16th December and our stock will be unavailable online as of the 16th December for 1-2 weeks.
